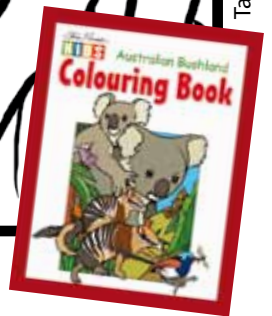

How to draw a Koala



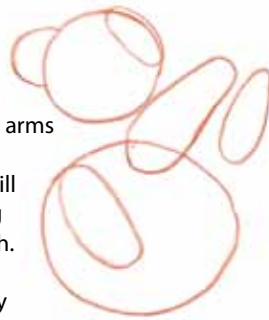
STEP 1.
Draw two circles, one slightly larger than the other, for the koala's round head and body respectively.



STEP 2.
A koala's ears always face forward. Draw an arc for the ear shown to the left of the head, and an oval for the ear to the right.



STEP 3.
Add some round ovals for the arms and one leg. This koala will be clutching a tree branch. Its other leg will be partly hidden by the branch.



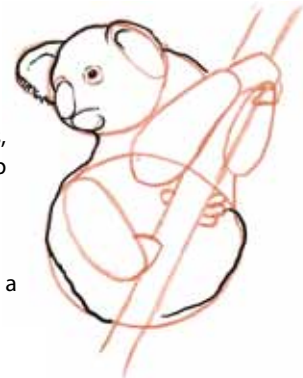
STEP 4.
Using straight lines, draw the branch. By drawing arches, you can add in the feet and hands.



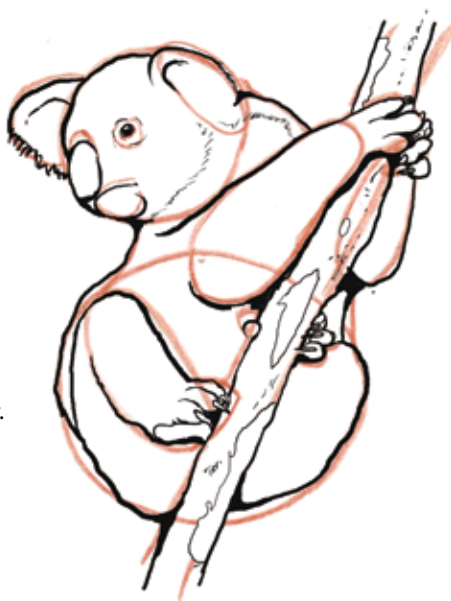
STEP 5.
Draw in the other foot using arches as shown. At this stage, sketch in the oval nose, the circular eye and the horse-shoe shaped mouth.



STEP 6.
After sketching in the facial features, use a black felt-tip pen to ink in the koala's outline. Light strokes and zig-zags help add a furry outline.



STEP 7.
Use thicker lines to suggest shadows and to give your drawing more depth. Add a few fine lines to suggest the texture of the fur.
